SC-028	Remote or isolated operation	Delayed emergency response	Communication blackspots, remote forestry or park work	Serious injury escalation, delayed rescue	Working Alone Procedure; check-ins; radios/phones; emergency contacts; site location details; first aid resources	10	4
SC-029	Fatigue during prolonged operation	Reduced concentration and reaction time	Long shifts, repetitive haul cycles, heat, vibration	Collision, rollover, poor judgement	Fatigue Management Procedure; scheduled breaks; fit-for-work expectations; supervisor monitoring	15	4
SC-030	Environmental disturbance	Erosion, excessive ground disturbance or work outside approved limits	Poor haul routes, wet ground, uncontrolled cut/fill	Environmental harm, client/regulatory action, rework	EMP/SSMP controls; approved work boundaries; drainage/erosion controls; supervisor oversight	12	4
SC-031	Recovery of bogged or disabled scraper	Stored energy / recovery equipment failure	Incorrect recovery points, unsuitable equipment, people in line of pull	Fatality, serious injury, plant damage	Planned recovery; rated recovery points/equipment; exclusion zone; competent personnel; clear communication	15	4
SC-032	Psychosocial hazards	Psychosocial hazards associated with the task	High workloads, production pressure, fatigue, repetitive operation, remote work and poor communication.	Stress, reduced concentration, poor decision making, psychological injury and increased incident risk.	Worker consultation; work planning and supervision; Fatigue Management Procedure; regular breaks; effective communication; reporting pathways.	12	6
